HISTORIAN'S REPORT

Centennial Biographical History of Richland County, Ohio, A. J. Baughman, Editor (1901), pages 196-8 has a Biographical Sketch of HENRY BACKENSTO. Part of the sketch is quoted in our 1993 Family History (D4 on page 123).

Our research, however, disagrees with the following quote from that sketch: The ancestry can be traced back to one of three brothers who emigrated from Germany to America some years prior to the Revolution. One of the brothers settled in the Empire state, another in Virginia and the third in Pennsylvania, and it is from that last named that the branch of the family to which our subject belongs is descended. When the yoke of British oppression became intolerable, and the colonies resolved to renounce allegiance to the mother country, the three brothers all joined the colonial army and loyally aided in the struggle for independence.

Our research disclaims the ancestry of three brothers from Germany. The records show that HANS ULRICH BAGGENSTOSS and wife Susanne Baur registered their intent on 5-16-1743 to emigrate from Rafz, Switzerland to Pennsylvania. They spoke German. They brought four sons and two daughters with them. We believe the father died during the sea voyage, for his name does not appear on the ship's record. The son, with the same name as his father, then age 16, appears on the captain's list. He made his mark on the Oath of Allegiance to the English government and the Oath of Abjuration. His name was written by a clerk, probably English-speaking, as BACKASTOS, later spelled in various ways, but BACKENSTOSS seemed prominent and was adopted by our Family Association.

Ulrich did not serve in the army. However, brother Johannes did serve. Little is known of brothers Henry and Jacob, although a HENRY BACKNSTOW did serve in the Revolutionary War.

A sister-in-law of HANS ULRICH, the father, and widow of HANS BAGGENSTOSS, a brother, came from Rafz, Switzerland the following year, 1744, bringing with her two sons---JACOB and JOHANNES. JACOB had two sons, ANDREW and JACOB, who served in the Revolution. JOHANNES also served during the Revolution; it was his son JOHN who moved to Virginia and sons JOSEPH and JACOB moved to Geneva, NY.

WHO'S WHO

A photograph was found in a book sold at an estate of Robert Smith in Rochester, New York in 1997. It was located in a hymnbook written in the Zulu language of South Africa.

Robert Smith was the son of Free Methodist missionaries to South Africa. The flyleaf of the Zulu hymnbook (published 1899) is stamped:

Edwalen Mission N.B. Smith (Robert's father??) Port Shepatone, Natal

A small scrap of paper in the book says that Robert (Smith's) parents were stationed at Adwelamia (Transval)

Natal, South Africa

The back of the photograph has the following writing:

<u>Dr. and Mrs. Backenstoe crossing the Umtamvuna River on a wire.</u> This was in South Africa. This was after Nathaniel (I assume this is Robert Smith's father(, myself (Robert's mother) and Robert and Fred (a brother) had come back to America.

I understand that now (?) there is a bridge on which to cross from Pondu Land to Natal.

The handwriting on the back of the photo matches hand-writing on an envelope with a 1952 postmark. The "now" in the letter probably refers to 1952.

Robert Smith and his wife, Francis, lived on Koladyne Avenue in Rochester since the 1930's. They had no children. Norma Grover, a sister-in-law of Carol (nee Backenstoe) Bence became the primary care-giver of Francis after the death of her husband in 1992. When Mrs. Smith moved from the residence to a nursing home, Mrs. Grover handled the sale of her household possessions, including a small library. When the Zulu hymnal was not purchased, Norma Grover decided to give the book to her brother Dr. Clarence Bence, who is a professor of religion at Indiana Wesleyan University. A colleague of Dr. Bence's served as a missionary to the Zulu people of South Africa before joining the faculty at Indiana Wesleyan.

In leafing through the hymnal, Mrs. Grover noticed the old photo and recognized the Backenstoe name as that of her sister-in-law. Thus the photo returns to the Backenstoe lineage.

DID YOU KNOW?

- REGINA BACKENSTOSS (C3 page 141) is listed as "Rachel" in her father's will and as "Rebecca" in the church marriage records.
- Our Historian, WOODY BACKENSTO, has had a book dedicated to him. It is a 746-page, biodiscography, entitled: The Red Nichols Story - After the Intermission - 1942-1965. Woody wrote "The Foreword", the last eulogy in the tome, and is quoted or referenced through the treatise.
- Our current Family Association Board of Directors includes three brothers: DAVID M. and twins GERALD J. and THOMAS E. BACKENSTOE (page 187). Their father, Hon. JOHN E. BACKENSTOE who served as Association President in three different decades, continues as a Director.
- ♦ WILLIAM V. BACKENSTO (page 177) is reported in Ripley's "Believe It Or Not" as an exceptional student athlete. While at the University of Toledo, OH he had a 3.8 undergraduate average, plus numerous scholastic honors, and was captain of their basketball team with a 23-2 record in his senior year.
- ♦ William's brother, DAVID R. BACKENSTO (page 178) was No. 1 nationwide Mutual Fund salesman for E. F. Hutton in 1984.
- NONNIE BACKENSTOE, wife of our Treasurer, chairs the important Marketing Committee of the Pennsylvania German Society.
- Radio announcements for the "Vac N Sew" chain of stores has been confused with our family name.
- Only 160 copies of the BACKENSTOSS -- BAGGENSTOSS Family History and Addendum are still available for sale. No more will be printed. Future Addenda will be coded back to this comprehensive treatise. Act now! They make ideal birthday or Christmas presents.
- ♦ EFFIE MAY (BACKENSTO) Blickem (1884-1974, see page 238) was a seamstress by trade. Customers could point to pictures in catalogs and she could make the dress. Arthritis struck her hard but she maintained her clear mind and good sense of humor. Crocheted even after she was blind. According to her parents, the family name was originally BACKENSTOSH which means "The baker's helper who puts bread into ovens and takes it out". MINNESOTA BRANCH UPDATE


as reported to our Historian, Woody Backensto

- The day was a busy one---with bus tours to the farm, the cemetery, and old family church (details were described in a brochure).
- They prepared an elaborate Family Cookbook (copies are still available from the compilers, Mr. & Mrs. Kelly Baggenstoss, Rout 2, Box 53, Gaylord, MN 55334 for \$10 each plus postage).
- An overflow of family pictures submitted for the Cookbook were made available in a separate pamphlet. (Joyce Lobitz, their secretary, sent me a copy of all the above material to share with those attending our Pennsylvania Reunion in August)
- ♦ 32 Family Histories were sold including 2 donated to Historical Societies. (Since I couldn't take the books to Minnesota personally, on my way to FL in February I dropped them off with Lois & Ed Schichting, who are now Florida residents, and they took them to the MN reunion. Remember, Lois & Ed attended the PA reunion in 1996.)

Of Historical Note

By contacting some of the Minnesota Baggenstosses when updating our Family History in 1970, they learned of our Family Association in Pennsylvania. MINARS & wife LORRAINE BAGGENSTOSS took the initiative to start the MN reunions. Minars died in 1978 and his wife in 1996, but BAGGENSTOSS cousins such as Joyce Lobitz, Lois Schlichting, GLEN, MILTON, KELLY, to name a few, have done a fine job of keeping the tradition alive.
