BACKENSTOSS HISTORIES NOW AVAILABLE ON CD!

The two volume Backenstoss Family History is now available on a Compact Disc. The indexes list all the family and proper names contained in the history from 1743 up to and including 2002. The History is enriched with irreplaceable information about the origin and meaning of the family name, the Coat of Arms, the original homestead in America, the will of Ulrich Backenstoss, passenger lists, and a history of the Family Association. The "Did You Know" feature of the Addendum is priceless. Finally, there is information about the Oregon, Washington State, Canadian, Minnesota and other branches of the family in North America as well as Switzerland, Germany, England and New Zealand.

It is recommended that a first time viewer read the Table of Contents, the Forward and the other introductory pages as well as the explanations of the historical format used by the historian. The history was originally contained in two printed volumes – the first published in 1993, followed by an Addendum published in 2002. Within the new CD format, the indexes of each volume are set forth separately for immediate access. Each volume in then presented in 50 page blocks, again, for easier access.

A review of the opening pages of both books will give the reader some acquaintance with the breadth and depth of the manuscript. It is only then that the reader will gain some insight into the enormous contribution that our previous historian and author, Elwood Bruce Backensto, has rendered to the family, indeed to the historical community in general. This work represents a lifetime of dedicated effort and perseverance for which we all are grateful.

Thanks also go to our present historian, the Honorable John E. (JEB) Backenstoe, for conceiving the idea of converting our Family History to a CD format and personally following that task through to its successful completion. His foresight and effort have written their own significant chapter in our family history.

This Year's Program

This year we will be honored with a visit from none other than Benjamin Franklin – as presented by Joshua A. Fink.

Most Americans have learned about Benjamin Franklin from textbooks back in grade school. There is no doubt that Franklin was a great man – printer, inventor, scientist, statesman, diplomat – one of the founding fathers who helped America win its independence from Great Britain. Franklin was a complex man of wit and wisdom and the only man to sign four of America's founding documents.

Come and enjoy a presentation, by none other than Benjamin Franklin himself, portrayed by local historian, Joshua Arthur Fink. When and where was Franklin born? Who is Silence Dogood? Why did John Antes, son of Henry Antes, write to Franklin in 1779? What did Franklin leave in his will to his son William, the loyalist governor of New Jersey? These questions will be answered through a first person interpretation of Franklin.

Joshua Arthur Fink is the Museum Curator and Historian at the Liberty Bell Museum at historic Zion's Reformed Church in Allentown, the place where the Liberty Bell was hidden during the American Revolution.

In Memoriam

Miriam Bagenstose, 85, a director of our Family Association, passed away on Friday, June 8, 2007 at the Essa Flory Hospice Center, Lancaster, PA.

Miriam was born on January 6, 1922, in Lancaster, and was the daughter of the late Guy and Viola Rollman Musser. She was the wife of the late Earl A. Bagenstose who died in 1996. In addition to her many contributions to the Backenstoss Family Association, Miriam was an active member of the Millersville Lions Club. In 1996, she was the recipient of the Melvin Jones Award from Lions International.

Miriam belonged to the Red Hat Society and was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Lancaster, PA. In her role as mother to her three children (Sue, Jere and David) she was active in both the Boy and Girl Scouts and was instrumental in developing the Y-Teens Program at the Lancaster YMCA. Miriam is also survived by six grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.

Miriam's energy, humor and grace will be greatly missed. The Board of Directors extends sincere condolences to Miriam's family along with our heartfelt appreciation for her many years of service to the Backenstoss Family Association.




A GROUP PICTURE TAKEN AT OUR 2006 REUNION
