Retires as BFA Secretary



Street Address: 9350 Longswamp Rd., Mertztown PA 19539

Directions

Take Fleetwood/Lyons/Topton road (Main Street) to Topton (Weis Street). Continue through Topton (Main Street) through Longswamp to Lower Longswamp. Turn left at the Blue Orchid Inn onto Smith Lane. Continue to stop sign, turn right -- park entrance is 0.8 mile on your right, across from Brookvue Farms sign.

From Route 222 (Monterey): Take L.R. 06138 to Five Points, turn right, continue to Topton. Turn left at the traffic signal, follow directions above.

From Route 100: Turn left at Hereford onto Hereford Road (L.R. 06119.) Continue through Harlem, Seisholtzville, Red Lion, and Maple Grove to Lower Longswamp. Turn right at the Blue Orchid Inn onto Smith Lane. Continue to stop sign, turn right -- park entrance is 0.8 mile on your right, across from Brookvue Farms sign.

Hello again family members.

The New Year always brings with it new opportunities for projects and ideas to build upon the Backenstoss Family Association's wonderful foundation. This year, a proposal was introduced that we hope will help bring us closer together by sharing some family stories that will highlight our diversity and talents. Many such stories already exist in the pages of the Backenstoss Family History, but it is 2015 now and there must be countless untold stories to be shared. I have one to share with all of you.

I was in the 4th grade [I think], in the early 1960's, attending Charles S. Foos elementary school in Reading, 2 blocks from my home. No buses necessary. I remember being herded into the auditorium where the entire 4th grade class was being screened for any latent musical talent. I didn't know it at the time but my and my sister's blood was thick with it! If you screened positive, you were given options of a musical band instrument to try. When I told mom and pop about this exciting opportunity, they told me the choice was clear... I was to play the clarinet, in the hopes that someday I could progress to the more challenging saxophone and follow in my father's footsteps! What? Pop played sax? I had no idea!

Earl [W. Bagenstose], my dad, never really talked much about it, but when I was alone with mom, she would tell me all about pop's early days playing sax and clarinet with his bandmates in the 'Greystone Club' in the late 1920's and into the 1930's... yep, during prohibition. There weren't too many places with a live band playing that didn't have some bathtub gin flowing, so there was always the risk of the 'feds' bringing on a raid!

Well, pop never went to jail, and I never learned to play sax but my sister went on to be a fabulous classical piano player [my greatest inspiration], and I ended up playing a pretty good guitar, and some piano – after all, it was the 60's when hair got long and music got loud. To this day, I still perform around southeastern Pennsylvania with various fellow musicians and groups.... And, yes, the baton has been passed to my son Chris, our BFA webmaster, who is rocking the new century with his guitars and bandmates.

So the beat goes on. 2015 is the 88th year of the establishment of the BFA. ...12 more years till our centennial and it will be here before you know it. I bet there are many such stories we'd love to tell each other. So be on the lookout for news of the Backen-Story sharing program we hope will be lots of fun and interest to all family members.

BITS OF OUR BACKENSTOSS BACKGROUND

(compiled by Ronnie Backensto/May 2015)

The list of immigrants to Pennsylvania show that on October 7, 1793, Hans Ulrich Backenstoss arrived at the port of Philadelphia on the ship "St. Andrew." He settled shortly after his arrival in Bern Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania, where many Swiss immigrants were already domiciled, the township having received its name from the Swiss capital. (Page 15/1949 History)

At the 7th Annual Reunion in 1933, a memorial for Hans Ulrich Backenstoss, was dedicated. A short memorial service was held followed by the unveiling of the monument erected, "in memory of Hans Ulrich Backenstoss and family." (Page 154/1949 History)

The Backenstoss Family Association of America was organized on August 24, 1927 at Kutztown, PA. The Constitution and By-Laws were adopted on August 18, 1929 at Belleman's Church, Berks County, PA where the 3rd annual reunion was held. (Pages 150 & 153/1949 History)

The name Backenstoss was well known in northeastern Switzerland and adjoining Germany in which jurisdiction Rafz is located, a small Swiss village north of the Rhine. (Pages 11 & 12/1949 History)

There is another branch of the Backenstoss clan that is quite numerous, located in and around Gersau, and associated with the exploits of William Tell. It seems the Gersau branch is not as old as the Rafz branch. It is reported to be 100% Roman Catholic. (Pages 11 & 12/1949 History)

Martin Baggenstos, born 1887, was a son of a small farmer under very moderate conditions is Gersau. In 1907, he left for Rome as a twenty year old Vatican Guardist recruit. Through his accuracy, being very conscientious, zealous and able, it was through these virtues he made the advancement as Captain of the Swiss Guards of the Vatican. (Page 172/1949 History)

In 1948, Clarence Smith wrote to his cousin, Dr. Martin Backenstoe, in Emmaus from Vienna, Austria. He mentioned having visited "every corner of Switzerland." At Lucerne, he met Herman Baggenstoss of Gersau. Of the 1,600 inhabitants of Gersau, 400 are named Baggenstoss! People mostly own very small farms and feel rich and happy to own a few cows and sheep. They get along with very little and lead a happy and contented life. The Gersau Baggenstoss are an offspring of a 200 year older Baggenstoss body located at Rafz. Our ancestor, Ulrich Baggenstoss, came from Rafz, a Protestant village. We can all feel happy to know that we originated from a good family stock. (Pages 114&169/1949 History)

Clarence Edwin Henry Smith (see preceding paragraph) was born in April 1890, one of four sons of Amanda Backenstoe and Edwin Henry Smith of Upper Milford Township. He was a contractor and cement builder in Allentown, PA. He was a Chief Executive Engineer on the staff of General Dwight D. Eisenhower in Europe during WWII. He had charge of all road and bridge building in Austria. (1949 History)

There were no reunions for the years 1942-1945 inclusive, due to WWII. On August 11, 1946, our 16th Annual Reunion was held at Jerusalem Western Salisbury U.C.C. near Emmaus, PA . (Page 154/1949 History)
