2020 B.F.A. REUNION TO BE HELD AT CRYSTAL CAVE

This year's Backenstoss Family Association reunion will be something of a departure from our recent gatherings. Instead of the relative quiet of a picnic grove, church hall or fish pond, the more commercially oriented facilities at Crystal Cave will provide a greater range of activities for our family members. This change also requires us to modify some of our previous procedures.

Most importantly, the B.F.A., in addition to providing hot dogs and cold drinks for our members, will schedule two groups, each consisting of up to 25 participants, for tours of the world famous Crystal Cave. Please provide the names and ages of those who wish to tour Crystal Cave. Also, if leaving a phone message, be sure to include a phone number where you can be reached. We will confirm reservations in the same manner, email or phone call, in which the reservation was made.

The 55 minute tours include a "comfortable walking" experience. The cave entrance is located uphill and at a moderate distance from where our reunion will be held. Please keep this in mind when determining which family members will be able to participate in and enjoy the tours.

Whether or not you tour Crystal Cave, there are many other attractions to occupy your time. The promotional information on pages 4 and 5 of this newsletter describes many of the sites and activities. Some of the attractions are part of the site, but other activities, such as the miniature golf course and certain educational programs require additional fees. We encourage you to call Crystal Cave directly if you have questions about the offerings and facilities. Gift, rock and souvenir shops, a museum, ice cream parlor and cafe' should all be open on the date of our reunion.

Our reunion will be held in the pavilion area behind the Ice Cream Parlor. Picnic tables will be available. There is a lawn area located next to the pavilion, so feel free to bring lawn chairs, blankets, etc. The main parking lot and lavatories are located nearby.


2019 BACKENSTOSS REUNION HUNSICKER'S GROVE; MERTZTOWN, PA





Step into a dazzling display of crystal magnificence carved slowly and exquisitely by nature through the passage of time. Known for its profuse and superb ornamentation, Crystal Cave's fascinating beauty has delighted millions of tourists for over 145 years. Thousands of sparkling calcite and aragonite crystals in various shades and color are believed to have been what gave Crystal Cave its name. This fairyland of geology contains an abundance of stalactites, stalagmites, delicate flutings, flowstone, drapery, rimstone, boxwork, and dripstone, cleverly accentuated by indirect lighting.

Crystal Cave is considered one of Pennsylvania's greatest natural wonders. Stone draperies in graceful folds, frozen fountains of rock, beautiful and startling formations at every turn – these are part of the vast array of stunning natural sculptures which bring thousands of visitors to Crystal Cave every year. Other marvels of stone formations include the Cathedral Chamber, the Prairie Dogs, the Ear of Corn, the Tobacco Leaves, the Natural Bridge, the Ice Cream Cone, the Totem Pole, and the Crystal Ballroom where dances were once held over 120 years ago. Crystal Cave is a remarkable wonder of nature.

Your 55-minute guided tour begins with an educational movie called "*Inside the Earth*". The comfortable walking tour continues along safe concrete walkways with steel railings while knowledgeable guides provide an informative tour. Millions of adults and children have been thrilled by this splendid subterranean museum of nature. The trip becomes an exciting experience for the whole family to enjoy and a pleasant memory.




GENERAL INFORMATION


Crystal Cave is in the Capital of the Pennsylvania Dutch Area, midway between Allentown and Reading, near Kutztown, Berks County. It is only a short drive off U.S. Routes 222, 22, 78, and 61.

104 miles from New York City, 82 miles from Newark, N.J., 69 miles from Trenton, N.J., 60 miles from Philadelphia, 73 miles from Wilmington, Del., 112 miles from Baltimore, Md., and 69 miles from Harrisburg. Traveling good roads, Crystal Cave can be reached in 2 hours from New York and 1½ hours from Philadelphia. Always free car and motor coach parking.
